Josep Vila i Casañas





Conductor, composer and pedagogue, Josep Vila i Casañas was born in Sabadell, Spain, in 1966. His specialism is the a cappella repertoire, as well as choral and orchestral literature down the ages. He conducts the Lieder Càmera Chamber Choir from Sabadell and collaborates often as guest conductor with the Francesc Valls Chamber Choir, a professional vocal ensemble engaged to the Sagrada Família church and to Barcelona's Cathedral. He has served as the resident conductor of the Orfeó Català choral society (1998-2016), the Cor de Cambra of the Palau de la Música Catalana (2011-2016), the Radiotelevisión Española Choir (2007-2010). He has worked as a guest conductor with choirs and

orchestras such as the Spanish National Choir, the Swedish Radio Choir, the Choir of the Franz Liszt Academy of Music in Budapest, the Venezuelan Simón Bolivar National Youth Choir, the Radiotelevisión Española Orchestra, and the Catalan Baroque Orchestra. As a composer, his main area of interest is music for voice and instruments, and he has written an extensive body of works for children's and youth choirs, for mixed a cappella choirs and for choir and orchestra. Since 2005, he has taught choir conducting at the Catalonia Music High School.

Michael Grohotolsky




Michael Grohotolsky was born in Vienna, where he started his musical carreer as an alto soloist with the Vienna Boys Choir. He studied music and voice education and since 2006 he has been Senior Lecturer for conducting and ensemble leading at the University of Music and Performing Arts Vienna. Michael Grohotolsky has been artistic director of the Wiener Kammerchor (Vienna chamber choir) since 2007. From 2000 to 2007 he was artistic director of the Chorus Viennensis – consisting of former members of the Vienna Boys Choir. In November 2001 he was appointed choral director of the Neue Oper Wien (new opera Vienna). From 2009 to 2016 he was artistic director of the Landesjugendchor Wien (regional youth choir Vienna). Since

2009 he has been leading the youth choir of the Wiener Chorschule (Vienna choir school) at the University of Music and Performing Arts Vienna. In 2016 Michael Grohotolsky founded the Youth Choir Academy Vienna, which he is still leading today. Since September 2017 he has been artistic director of the Chorus Juventus – the choir of the upper secondary at the Vienna Boys Choir school.

During the course of his musical carreer so far, Michael Grohotolsky has conducted major works for choir and orchestra with renowned orchestras like the ORF Vienna Radio Symphony Orchestra, the Austro-Hungarian Haydn Phiharmonic and the L'Orfeo Barockorchester. In addition to his work as conductor and choir leader, he is a soughtfor guest lecturer, workshop leader and juror at various choir competitions in Austria and abroad. He was awarded the prize for young choir leaders by the Erwin Ortner Fonds in 2003.
